

Welcome to Mainz



Founded by the Romans as Mogontiacum, Mainz is one of the oldest cities in Germany. With a history of over 2000 years, Mainz has much to offer: situated at the confluence of the Rhine and Main rivers, Mainz has a sizeable university, fine pedestrian precincts and a certain "savoir vivre" whose origins go back to the Napoleon's occupation at the turn of the 18th century – at least that's what the "Mainzer" say.

Strolling along the Rhine river, enjoying the sun in the beer gardens, and sampling local wines in a half-timbered wine tavern in the *Altstadt* (old part of the city) are as much part of any Mainz visit as visiting the impressive Romanesque *Dom St. Martin* (St. Martin Cathedral), Marc Chagall's ethereal windows in *St. Stephan's Kirche* (Church of St. Stephan) or the first printed bible in the Gutenberg Museum. In the 15th century, local hero Johannes Gutenberg perfected moveable type and became known as the inventor of modern book printing – the man of the millennium.

Not only is Mainz the capital of the federal state of Rhineland-Palatinate, but also one of the "Great Wine Capitals" of the world along with Bordeaux and Napa Valley.

COVID-19 GUIDELINES Regulations for events at IMB

To ensure a safe environment for all participants, we will be requiring **testing and masks** during the event.

- Please do not come to IMB if you have any COVID-like symptoms. If this is the case, please inform <u>sfb1361@imb.de</u>.
- Upon arrival at the venue, you must present a negative antigen self-test result every day (tests must be performed in the mornings of the event with the rapid tests provided by IMB/SFB 1361)
- Masks are only required if the minimum distance to other persons is less than 1.5 m (i.e. in the lecture hall)
- Disinfectant dispensers are available at the entrance, in all meeting rooms and toilets. Regular hand disinfection is recommended. Mobile air filters are set up on-site
- Please note that while monitoring the current Corona situation, IMB reserves the right to change the mask recommendation back to a mask requirement

Arriving at Frankfurt Airport

Take a taxi to Mainz


• Taxis can be found on Level 1 in Terminal 1 or Level 2 in Terminal 2 outside of the airport. The taxi costs to Mainz are around 50-60 EUR.

Take the train to Mainz

- On arrival at Terminal 1 (A, B, C) or Terminal 2 (D, E) make your way to the Regional Train Station (S). Terminal 1 and 2 are connected by the "Sky Line", a free monorail train leaving every 3 minutes.
- The Regional Train Station (S) is located underground (Level 0) in Terminal 1, section B. There is also a long distance train station (T) which you can ignore.



- Your train: S-Bahn S8 (direction Wiesbaden Hbf) or RE (direction Koblenz or Saarbrücken) (Regional Express)
- Frequency: every 10-20 minutes.

How to buy a ticket

At the Travelcenter

Queue up at the **Reisezentrum** and buy it from the counter. You need to draw a number and may have to wait a little while.



Ticket machine step by step

- 1. Choose language
- 2. Select destination (Wiesbaden/Mainz)
- 3. Select single journey
- 4. Select the route of your travel (via Rüsselsheim)

- 5. Pay 5.60 EUR
- 6. Take your ticket (and change)

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At the ticket machine

- If you have some Euros (ideally coins but most machines also take small notes) buy your ticket from a machine. Navigation is available in English.
- You can also pay with Girocard, ٠ VisaCard or MasterCard.
- ٠ The machine automatically dispenses change.

Finding the train to Mainz

- Check blue sign: Regional trains, track 2-3
- The platforms are one level below the ticket hall and the travel center. Proceed to platform 3. Some Regional Expresses to Mainz leave from platform 2. (Make sure you don't go to the long distance train station [T])
- Take the train **S8** from platform 3 to Wiesbaden Hbf or **RE** trains to either Koblenz or Saarbrücken.(Do not take the train S9, which also goes to Wiesbaden but does not stop at Mainz Central Station.)
- Attention: Your trains depart from Frankfurt Airport in two directions. Your direction is to Wiesbaden Hbf.
- The journey takes around 30 minutes.
 If you want to go to IMB exit at Mainz Main Station Mainz Hbf.

Getting to IMB from Mainz Main Station

By public transport

Go to stop **Hauptbahnhof** with the letter **A**, **B** or **L** (see map below). Take tram 51 (stop A) or tram 53 (stop L) or tram 59 (stop B) to IMB until stop **Hochschule Mainz** and walk around 10 min to IMB.

All trams also leave from Hauptbahnhof West.

Alternatively, you can take the **bus 9** (stop **F**) if available. This bus drives across the University Campus and stops right in front of IMB, stop **Duesbergweg**, but only operates at a reduced timetable.


<u>By taxi</u>

When leaving the station through the main entrance you can find the taxis on the left hand side. The taxi costs to IMB are around 12.00 EUR.

Timetable Tram 51/53 Hauptbahnhof & Hauptbahnhof West to IMB (Hochschule Mainz B)



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- Important: you need to consult the column on the left hand side (Schule)
- Tram 51 and 53 depart from Hauptbahnhof or Hauptbahnhof West
- The number and destination of the tram – in this case 51/53 Lerchenberg/Hindemithstrasse - is shown at the front of the tram
- Exit at stop Hochschule Mainz
- A single ticket costs **3.20 EUR**. You can buy a ticket directly from the driver or from the ticket machines in front of the main station.
- Tram 51 or 53 also take you back to Hauptbahnhof

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



What to see in Mainz



Cathedral St. Martin

Along with the cathedrals in Worms and Speyer, Mainz cathedral is one of the three Rhenish Imperial cathedrals. In 975 the Archbishop Willigis began with the construction of this great cathedral, modelling it on St. Peter's in Rome. Shortly before its day of consecration in August 1009 the cathedral burned down. The oldest surviving pieces of ornamentation from this time are the bronze door panels of the market portal. Rebuilt in the 12th century with deep red sandstone and topped with an octagonal tower, the cathedral is quintessentially Romanesque. ADDRESS: Markt 10, 55116 Mainz

St. Stephan's Church

This Gothic Church was erected in the 13th century and stands on the foundations of the basilica built in Ottonian-pre-Romanesque style around 990. St. Stephan's is the only German church for which the Russian-Jewish artist Marc Chagall created nine brilliant, stained glassed windows. Bright blue and imbued with a mystical, meditative quality, they serve as a symbol of Jewish-Christian reconciliation.

Gutenberg-Museum

Experience the history of printing, writing and books in one of the oldest museums of printing in the world. Two original Gutenberg Bibles of the mid-15th century are among the most valuable treasures of the Museum. Another main attraction is a reconstruction of Johannes Gutenberg's workshop where he perfected moveable type and thus became known as the inventor of modern book printing. With a large number of typographic instruments, old presses and typesetting machines and printed works from the 15th century, the history of letterpress printing comes to life at the Gutenberg Museum. A visit to the museum's educational print shop (Druckladen) is equally interesting. At the Druckladen, with the assistance of its expert staff, everybody can have a go at typesetting and printing.

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
